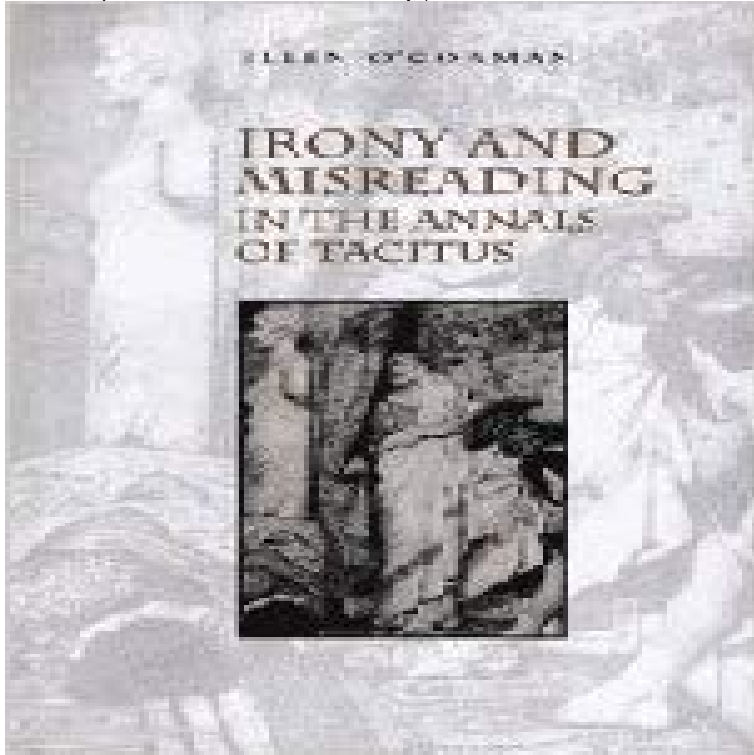


Irony and Misreading in the Annals of Tacitus
