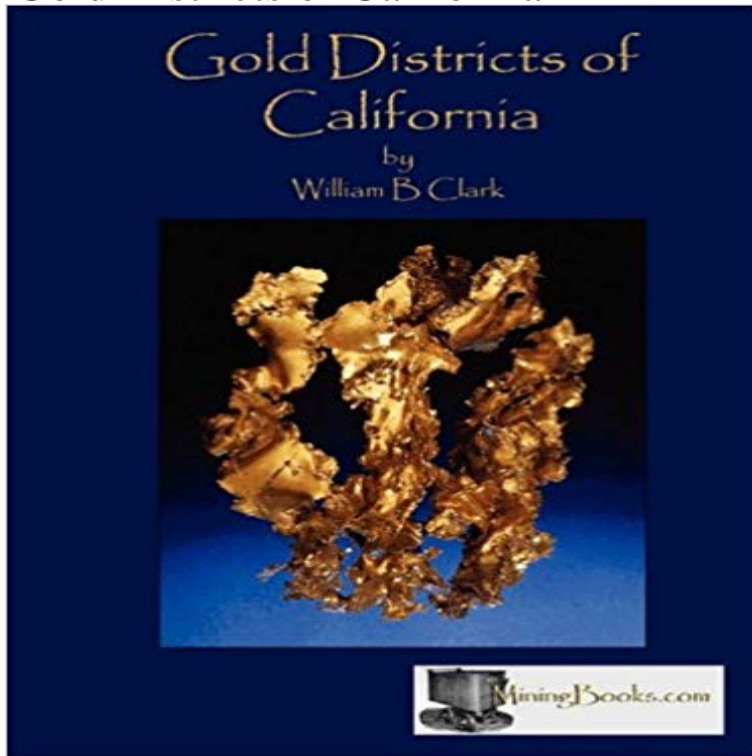


Gold Districts of California
