
The Poems of Lemuel Havnes



Lemuel Haynes (1753-1833) was an influential African-American minister in early American history. The son of a black father and a white mother, Haynes grew up as an indentured servant. He served as a minuteman in the American Revolutionary War and then served for forty years as a Congregational minister. He was a prolific author; several of his sermons, essays, and poems have survived to this day. This book contains two significant poems. The Battle of Lexington tells the story of the opening battle of the Revolutionary War. Death of Mr. Asa Burt illustrates his rich pastoral ministry.Both poems are edited to reflect modern grammar, usage, and style.
